ZRex: Call for Papers



The journal **Zeitschrift für Rechtsextremismusforschung (ZRex)** is calling for full papers on the topic of right-wing extremism and related issues from all disciplines. Empirical, methodological, theoretical as well as practice-related contributions are welcome.

Full papers are being accepted on a rolling basis and can be handed in at all times. For contributions that will appear in issue 6 (publication planned for October 2023), we ask for submission by March 15, 2023.

ZRex is open to papers from overlapping and adjacent fields of research (e.g. research on anti-Semitism, racism, Nazism or social cohesion), as long as a connection to the extreme right is given.

The regional focus of the journal is on Europe and the US, but ZRex is open to examples from other regions of the world. Contributions in both German and English are welcome.

The journal only publishes original papers. By submitting their manuscript, authors declare that their contribution has not already been published or submitted elsewhere. All papers will go through a double-blind peer review process. Hence, please avoid the author's name, conspicuous self-citations, project names etc. that might indicate authorship.

Length of contribution: 30,000 to max. 50,000 characters including spaces, footnotes, bibliography and additional information. For further information, please consult our manuscript instructions.

Possible topics for contributions can be:

- current developments, e.g. on the extreme right and the Russian war against the Ukraine
- historical and current analyses of the development of extreme right organisations, parties and movements
- right-wing extremism in parliaments and governments
- history of ideas, production of ideology and discourse strategies of the far right
- right-wing extremist attitudes and group-based enmities
- individual, collective and societal right-wing radicalisation
- right-wing violence, right-wing terrorism and hate crime
- anti-Semitism and racism
- gender and right-wing extremism
- influences and connections between manifestations of right-wing extremism and social cohesion
- digitalisation of right-wing extremism
- interactions between right-wing extremism and religious fundamentalism
- international developments and comparisons; local and country comparisons
- practical reflections and evaluations of countermeasures
- literature reviews
